What is a Child Development Permit?

*A permit issued by the California Department of Education that allows an individual to secure employment in a children's educational program funded with federal, state, county or local mon-
eys. (School Districts, Head Start and State Pre-
school, Before and After School Care, Campus Lab
Centers)*

How do I apply?

You may download the forms online or contact First 5, Office of Early Care and Education for a CARES application, if eligible The Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) will pay the application processing fees for first time, renewing and upgrading of the six levels of the Child Development Permit. The CDTC will also reimburse first-time permit applicants \$56 of the live scan fingerprinting processing fee.
